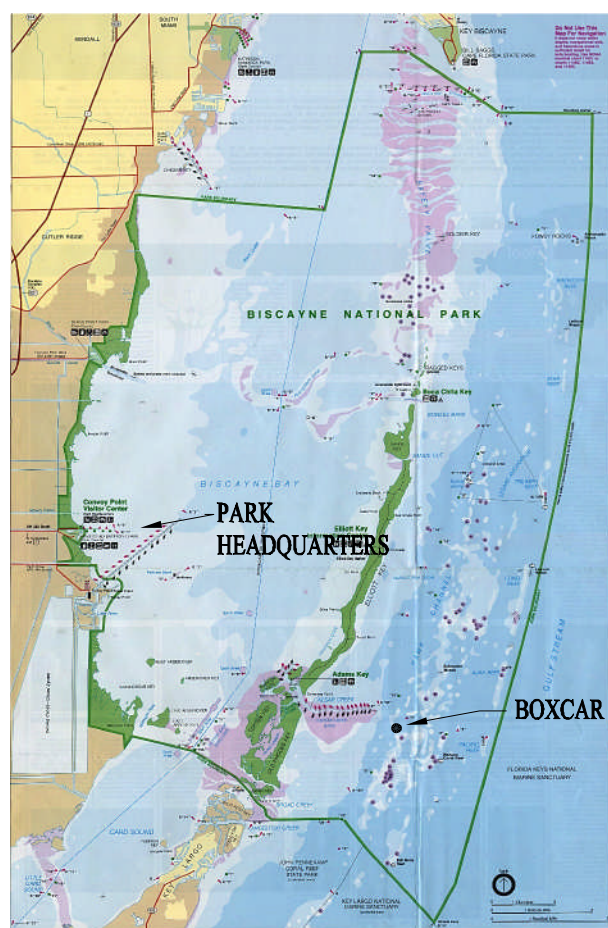

Diving with a Purpose (DWP) offers a new adventure and a different challenge for veteran divers, underwater archeology.

The DWP course is an intense full week program that teaches the basics of underwater archeology. This program usually consists of one day of instruction on land, followed by three days of diving and debriefing, ending with the final drawing of the wreck site. Students learn two basic principles of underwater archeology: Trilateration mapping and In-Situ drawing.
